



Wild Caraway
(*Carum carvi*)



Wild Caraway was grown in Western Canada as a spice; however, it escaped cultivation and soon began infesting rangelands, pastures and natural areas. It can now be commonly found in mountain meadows, hayfields, and along irrigation ditches and roadsides. It prefers full sun and well drained soils. Infestations in forage crops can lead to seed dispersal in baled hay.

The plant is easiest to control in its first year of growth with a residual herbicide. Once the bolting has started, the plant becomes much more difficult to control, especially if it has been allowed to set seed.
