Build an Emergency Kit that includes:
Water - at least 5 litres per person per day for 3 days, for drinking and sanitation.
Food - at least a 3 day supply of non-perishable food.



Know how to operate your home's ventilation system.



Know your community's evacuation routes and shelter locations. Have a plan for pets and livestock.



Be prepared to evacuate or shelter-in-place with very little notice.



Ensure your vehicle has at least a half-tank of fuel at all times.

A WIDE VARIETY OF TRANSPORT VEHICLES FREQUENTLY TRAVEL HIGHWAYS THROUGH BRAZEAU COUNTY. A TRANSPORTATION ACCIDENT INVOLVING DANGEROUS GOODS, HAZARDOUS MATERIALS OR FLAMMABLES HAS THE POTENTIAL TO IMPACT THE COMMUNITY (FIRE AND/OR AIR QUALITY).

IN THE EVENT OF A TRANSPORTATION ACCIDENT INVOLVING DANGEROUS GOODS / HAZARDOUS MATERIALS OR FLAMMABLES:

Listen for emergency information and alerts and follow instructions.



If you are asked to evacuate, do so immediately.



If you are requested to stay indoors:

- Bring pets inside.
- Close all exterior doors and windows.
- Turn off air conditioners and ventilation systems so no outside air is drawn inside.



If you are caught outside:

- Stay uphill and upwind.
- In general try to go at least ¼ km from the danger area.



If you are in a motor vehicle:

- Stop and seek shelter in a permanent building. If you must remain in your car, keep car windows and vents closed and shut off the air conditioner and heat.

Do not leave the safety of a shelter to go outdoors to help others until authorities announce it is safe to do so.
